



GENERAL INTERNSHIPS

The Cambodian Center for Human Rights (CCHR) offers **General Internships** to non-Cambodians seeking work experience with a human rights organization. Internships last for a minimum of two months and can be arranged for any time of the year.

Duties and responsibilities

Working under the supervision of international and Cambodian staff, successful applicants will be required to work on matters including:

- organizational development tasks, including strengthening governance and management processes;
- communications tasks, including drafting press releases;
- building new relationships, including fundraising;
- formulating, implementing and reporting on projects; and
- miscellaneous non-law research relating to projects.

Requirements

Applicants must have an interest in and passion for human rights. They must have completed at least two years of an undergraduate degree. Post-graduates who have completed an undergraduate degree in a field related to management, organizational development, and/or communications are strongly encouraged to apply. Fluency in spoken and written English is required. Applicants must be able to commit to an internship of at least two months. Successful applicants must be able to bring and use a laptop computer with wireless internet functionality for the duration of their internship.

Organization

The CCHR is a non-political, independent, non-governmental organization that works to promote and protect democracy and respect for human rights throughout Cambodia. We focus primarily on civil and political rights, although we work on a variety of interlinked human rights issues. Members of staff are grouped into four specialist Units that reflect the scope of our work: Freedom of Expression; Fair Trials; Land Rights; and Democracy.
