



## **LEGAL INTERNSHIPS**

The Cambodian Center for Human Rights (CCHR) offers **Legal Internships** to non-Cambodians seeking legal work experience at a human rights organization. Internships last for a minimum of two months and can be arranged for any time of the year.

### **Duties and responsibilities**

Working under the supervision of legally qualified international and Cambodian staff, successful applicants will be required to work on matters including:

- legal research and writing as part of the CCHR's research and policy work;
- legal research to support the CCHR's projects; and
- administrative assistance to the CCHR's projects, in particular working on Trial Monitoring, Community Training, and Dialogue Projects.

### **Requirements**

Applicants must have knowledge of international human rights law and mechanisms. They must have completed at least two years of an undergraduate law, development studies, and/or human rights degree. Postgraduates who have completed an undergraduate degree in law and/or human rights are strongly encouraged to apply. Fluency in spoken and written English is required. Applicants must be able to commit to an internship of at least two months. Successful applicants must be able to bring and use a laptop computer with wireless internet functionality for the duration of their internship.

### **Organization**

The CCHR is a non-political, independent, non-governmental organization that works to promote and protect democracy and respect for human rights throughout Cambodia. We focus primarily on civil and political rights, although we work on a variety of interlinked human rights issues. Members of staff are grouped into four specialist Units that reflect the scope of our work: Freedom of Expression; Fair Trials; Land Rights; and Democracy.
